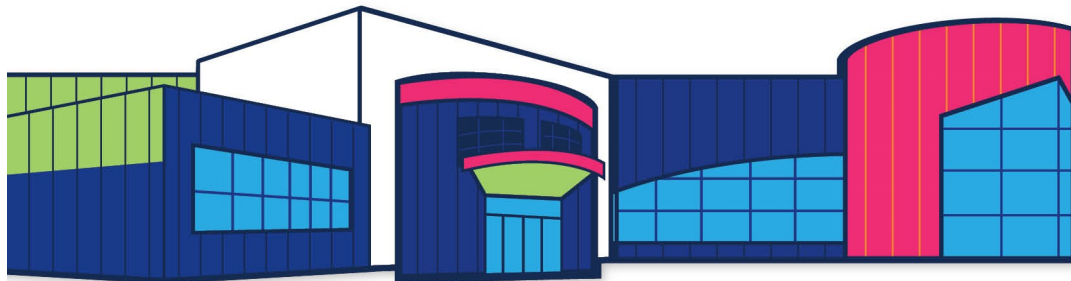

How to develop active citizens of tomorrow!

Transitioning from Preschool to Kindergarten isn't something of a serious matter. Its an exciting time that should continue to foster play practices, **as play seems to predict whether children will become active citizens and leaders of tomorrow.**

Executive function and Play were specifically examined (following students from kindergarten through to Grade 8) and connected to predicting student participation in extracurricular activities. In following, research has already shown that teens who participate in school activities are more likely to be active later as adults in volunteering, voting, and reaching out to public officials.

At a time when some parents and education pundits are pushing for more academic focus in the early years, the Steinhardt study helps to remind us that **play is one of the most important learning experiences we can give our children.**
